Re: Barb Walter Nomination

Barb Walter is a legend in Oklahoma journalism.

She is feisty, fearless, funny and the best friend a journalist could ever hope to have.

Just ask any journalist in Oklahoma, and many more scattered across the country. This woman is their idol.

Barbara A. Walter (no "s" on the end, please) is 69 years old and has been a journalist since the eighth grade, when she joined the staff of the *Classen Life* at Classen High School in Oklahoma City. As a 14-year-old freshman she became a teen correspondent for the *Oklahoma City Times*.

But perhaps her best training came when she joined the staff of the Oklahoma Press Association in 1962 as secretary and receptionist. She calls herself a graduate of the Ben Blackstock (longtime and legendary executive vice president of OPA) School of Management.

She had just graduated from high school. Most folks are amazed to learn she never attended college, but she had the ultimate in on-the-job training. At OPA, she advanced quickly to become editor of the *Oklahoma Publisher* and education director. And she could handle Ben Blackstock. She worked there for 16 years, and used that time to get to know virtually every newspaper publisher in the state.

She became one herself when she married Bill Walter and became co-publisher and managing editor of the Hennessey Clipper, a weekly newspaper owned by Bill's family since 1904. The Walters sold the paper at the end of last year, but Barb stayed on in her role as managing editor.

At the Clipper, she covers county, town and school board meetings, does crime reporting, writes a column and editorials and and lays out pages — yep, pretty much everything. She has won numerous for her columns, in-depth reporting and other efforts from NNA, OPA, SPJ, and the Oklahoma Writers Federation. The newspaper has won the Sequoyah Award, OPA's top prize, several times.

To say she is an active member of OPA is an understatement. In 2002, she became only the second female president in the history of the association (the first was appointed when her husband died). Her election to the OPA board was a major breakthrough for women journalists in Oklahoma, especially because Barb was considered a "rabble-rouser" by Blackstock and the "old guard."

She was a strong and fearless president, but perhaps made her greatest contributions to Oklahoma newspapers through her service on the Oklahoma Newspaper Foundation board. There she pushed and shoved her fellow board members into new territory — more training programs and the development of an intern program that now supplies many Oklahoma newspapers with summer interns paid by the foundation through grant funds. Many of the newspapers could not have afforded to pay an intern, and the program has been a Godsend to small, struggling weeklies in particular.

Barb served two terms as ONF chairman, the only woman ever to do so.

OPA members honored her service with the coveted Beachy Musselman award for outstanding contribution to newspaper journalism in 2005. She was inducted into the Oklahoma Journalism Hall of Fame in 2008.

As if that weren't enough, she found time to serve her community in a variety of ways. She serves on the board of directors (and is past president) of Hennessey United (Hennessey's version of a Chamber of Commerce); is past president Hennessey Lioness Club; founder/past officer/board member and 1989 co-grand parade marshal of Hennessey Celebration Inc.; was the 2013 co-chairman of the Hennessey Wine & Chocolate Festival; is an American Cancer Society volunteer and much more. In 2009, she received the Kingfisher County Bar Association's Liberty Bell award.

She is a member of Freedom of Information Oklahoma, SPJ and the First United Methodist Church of Hennessey.

The state election board named The Clipper the outstanding weekly newspaper for informing voters, and the newspaper was named "Hennessey's Business of the Century" by its readers at the turn of the century.

She was appointed by then-Gov. George Nigh as member of the Board of Regents of the Oklahoma College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery, and served as a regent from 1980-83.

She also proudly claims membership in the Hennessey and State Newspaper Ya-Yas — which she takes almost as seriously as she does her activities.

She is just amazing.

Perhaps her legacy is this: for years, weekly newspaper publishers across the state invariably turn to her when they need help, especially with those hard-to-handle stories and ethical questions. They implicitly trust her advice.

Could there be any higher compliment?

Please consider my friend Barb for the Emma C. McKinney Award. I believe she embodies everything that honor means.

Barbara A. Walter

Barbara A. (Barb) Walter, 68, started her journalism career when an eighth grader on the staff of the Classen Life at Classen High School, OKC. As a 14-year-old freshman she became a teen correspondent for the *Okla. City Times* and worked for Kay Dyer, Mary Goddard and Mary Jo Nelson. *Oklahoma Publisher* editor/education director, Oklahoma Press Association, 1962-78 and graduate Ben Blackstock/Lyndell Williams School of Management.; co-publisher/managing editor, Hennessey Clipper, 1978-present. National/state writing honors. Past president/treasurer Okla. Press Assn./Okla. Newspaper Foundation, current foundation member, and Ya-Ya Sisterhood. County Bar Liberty Bell Award, ONF Musselman Award, Journalism Hall of Fame. Community service, 34 years; wife, 41 years; mother, 47 years; grandmother, 31 years.

Barbara A. "Barb" Walter, 68, became managing editor of The Hennessey Clipper newspaper in 1978, and was later named co-publisher by her husband, Bill Walter. They have been married for more than 41 years, and the newspaper has been in her husband's family since 1904.

She was president of the Oklahoma Press Association (OPA) 2002-03 and served on the state board for seven years, including one year as treasurer. She has chaired and served on many OPA committees. She is two-term past president of the Oklahoma Newspaper Foundation, and the only woman to hold that office.

She was awarded the foundation's Beachy Musselman Award for outstanding contribution to newspaper journalism in 2005, and was inducted into the Oklahoma Journalism Hall of Fame in 2008. She received the Kingfisher County Bar Association's Liberty Bell Award in 2009.

Walter has judged state and national newspaper competitions and served on the NNA contests committee, and worked on postal and legislative affairs.

At the Hennessey paper, Walter covers the county commissioners, school and town boards, does the layout work on the publication, and is their bookkeeper. She also writes a column, "Couldn't Help But Notice," which has won awards in the National Newspaper Association, the Oklahoma Writers' Federation Inc., the Society of Professional Journalists (SPJ) and in OPA contests. She has also won awards for indepth-investigative newswriting and photography.

She is a member of FOI Oklahoma, SPJ and the First United Methodist Church of Hennessey.

The state election board named The Clipper the outstanding weekly newspaper for informing voters, and the newspaper has also won several Sequoyah Awards (sweepstakes) in the Oklahoma Press Association's yearly Better Newspaper Contest. The newspaper was also named "Hennessey's Business of the Century" by its readers at the turn of the century.

Walter serves on the Hennessey United Association board which was organized in 2000 to study, promote and complete improvements in the community. She is the board's liaison on the festival, events and culture committees and is a past president of the organization.

She is one of the three original founders of Hennessey Celebration Inc., a group organized to promote and preserve the history of the town. She served on the Celebration's board of directors and as secretary in the 1980s. She and her husband were selected co-grand marshals of the 1989 Pat Hennessy Celebration Parade.

She is a past president of the Hennessey Lioness Club and named Lioness of the Year in 1988. She was also a member of the Hennessey Word Weavers writing club and the Thursday Night Write Sisters.

Walter is also a member in good standing of the Hennessey Ya-Ya Sisterhood and the Newspaper Ya-Yas.

She was appointed by then-Gov. George Nigh as member of the Board of Regents of the Oklahoma College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery, and served as a regent from 1980-83.

Barbara Chastain Walter was born Sept. 25, 1944, in Oklahoma City, the daughter of Tom E. and Adele Chastain.

She was a Classen High School freshman when she started her newspaper career as a teen correspondent for the Oklahoma City Times. Walter continued that job throughout high school and graduated from Classen in Oklahoma City, in 1962.

Walter's first full-time job was as a receptionist and secretary for the Oklahoma Press Association in 1962. She soon started writing a column, "Front Desk," for their monthly newspaper, *The Oklahoma Publisher*, and later became editor of that newspaper. She also directed the planning of conventions, clinics, short courses and was in charge of other special projects and publications.

She and Bill Walter were married Aug. 21, 1971, in Oklahoma City.

She has one son, Nick Walter of Hennessey; one stepson, Courtney Walter of St. Louis, Mo., and three stepdaughters, Jill Jenkins and Amy Carpenter, both of Edmond, and Tracy Anderson of Midwest City. She has one granddaughter, Emerald S. Beckham, Enid, and seven stepgrandchildren: Jarrod Watson of New York City; Katy Watson, Stillwater; Kinsey Carpenter and Gracie Carpenter, both of Edmond; Rachel Bush Rodriquez of Benecia, Calif., and Dylan Walter and Cody Walter, both of Norman.
