Community Building Symposium

Research papers selected on newspapers and community building are presented at NNA's Annual Convention and Trade Show. Co-sponsored by NNAF and the Huck Boyd National Center for Community Media, the symposium includes such topics as encouraging community involvement through the newspaper, enhancing newspaper readership among specific groups in the community, addressing a diverse or multi-cultural audience, advertising issues and new technology.

Over \$6,000 per year is needed to continue this educational program.

Alan Cruikshank Scholars

The NNAF/Cruikshank Scholars program was created to honor Alan Cruikshank, a Fountain Hills, AZ, publisher, for his commitment to his community and to the community newspaper profession. Then-NNA President Robert (Bob) Sweeney unveiled the NNAF Cruikshank Scholars program in 2004, with the presentation of a \$10,000 grant from the Denver-based Kenneth King Foundation to support two scholars.

As part of its mission to enhance the role of community newspapers, the National Newspaper Association Foundation will select two NNAF Cruikshank Scholars at the University of Missouri—Columbia, School of Journalism for the 2008-2009 academic year. These graduate students will work out of the National Newspaper Association offices located on the University of Missouri—Columbia, campus.

We need \$5,000 for each scholar, per year to continue this valuable program.
