What To Do in Franklin

Coming to the convention early or staying a few extra days? There are plenty of exciting sights and experiences to enjoy while in the city of Franklin! Take a stroll into history with a walking tour or a visit to the local Civil War-era homes and battlefields. Enjoy where the small-town charms of Franklin's past meet the modern comforts of the present with a shopping trip at the Factory or among the town's many boutiques or at the annual Pilgrimage Festival. There's something in Franklin for everyone to enjoy.



The Carter House, a one and a half story brick farmhouse, was built in 1830 by Fountain Branch Carter and was used for Federal headquarters during the Battle of Franklin. Carnton Plantation, home to former Nashville mayor Randal McGavock and his family, was built in 1826 and was used as a Confederate field hospital during and after the Civil War's bloody Battle of Franklin. The Carter House and Carnton Plantation are open daily for guided tours. Both are conveniently located to downtown Franklin and are located approximately 1.25 miles from one another. Explore downtown Franklin's past and present with a guided walking tour from Franklin on Foot. With a variety of tour options (including a ghost tour, civil war tour, and a food tour, among others) highlighting different aspects of the town's top points of interest, there's something for everyone to explore. The Pilgrimage Music and Cultural Festival is an annual event celebrating the culture of Franklin and Williamson County and is happening the same weekend as the NNA convention! The festival features a varied lineup of musical artists (including Beck and Kasey Musgraves), a marketplace for artwork, wearables, and crafts, a showcase of local and regional wine, beers, and spirits, and a wide selection of local food vendors.
