Judy P. Griffin has been co-owner of the *Forney Messenger*, the only weekly newspaper in Forney and the oldest continuously-published newspaper in Kaufman County, with her husband Cary L. Griffin since the Griffins purchased the *Messenger* October 15, 1972.

Almost immediately, Judy showed her talents as a business manager and from the day the Griffins purchased the paper until now has been its business manager *de facto*. She officially received the title of business manager when the Griffins formed an S Corporation, Forney Messenger Inc., in 1990, at which time she also became treasurer of the corporation.

Judy began covering meetings of the school board and City Council for the paper during the mid-1980s in order to help publisher Cary Griffin, whose responsibilities as the paper's primary reporter by that time were growing considerably. Judy proved so astute in her coverage of these often complex meetings that Cary finally gave her full responsibility for covering them. While covering these meetings, Judy helped the paper develop positive and strong relationships with the city and the school district. Later, after a part-time reporter resigned, Judy also began covering meetings of the Kaufman County Commissioners Court, a responsibly she continues to carry out faithfully and which has also borne fruit in a good relationship between the county and the *Forney Messenger*.

Judy has proven very good at collecting overdue ad and other accounts.

Judy represents the *Forney Messenger* and its parent company very well in the community at large. She has served on several committees of and presently serves on the Board of Directors of the Forney Chamber of Commerce; has served as a member of the board of the Forney Arts Council, and is on the Ellen Brooks West Memorial Library board of directors. She often brings insights she has gained on these bodies to bear in her reporting.

Because of Judy's considerable acumen as a financial manager, Forney Messenger Inc. has no outstanding debt, and that enabled the paper to survive the steep economic downturn of 2008-2009 with little financial damage.

The Forney Messenger is the only independent newspaper in Kaufman County.

To the Emma C. McKinney Award Selection Committee In re: Accomplishments of the *Forney Messenger*

Under the ownership of Cary and Judy Griffin, the *Forney Messenger* has grown in the past 38.5 years from a six-page broadsheet with only a small core of regular subscribers into a comprehensive and credible source of local and county news.

Almost from the time the Griffins took over publication, the paper, which in the past had been rather isolated, began reaching out to its companion publications in Texas and beyond. One of the first major acts for the new owners was to join the Texas Press Association and the National Newspaper Association. In 1973, the *Forney Messenger* staff attended their first meeting of the North and East Texas Press Association.

The paper earned better newspaper award certificates from NETPA between 1972 and 1985. In 1983, the paper earned a first place in editorial writing and in 1985 earned a first place in feature writing. (An increasing volume of responsibility has prevented the *Messenger* from entering better newspaper contests in recent years.) In 1985 and 1986, the paper earned the Media Award from Keep Texas Beautiful, Inc. for its promotion of a beautification effort that in both years earned Forney the Governor's Achievement Award for Beautification—the only community ever to have won this recognition in two consecutive years. More recently, the *Messenger* was nominated several times by the Forney school board for the Media Award of the Texas Association of School Boards for outstanding coverage of local education, and each time, the *Messenger* got the award. The *Messenger* has also earned recognition several times from Metro Creative Services for its annual Christmas issue.

The *Messenger* staff attended their first GAC in the mid-1970s and attended their first NNA convention in 1979 in Orlando, Florida.

In 1997, the *Messenger* received a Texas Historical Marker designating the paper, which began publication in 1896, as an official part of Texas history.
