Sherry Melissa Hanna was born March 1, 1977. She graduated from North Augusta High School in 1995 and received a degree from USC Aiken in Communications in 2000. She received a SC Press scholarship while a student at USC Aiken and worked that summer for the Aiken Standard as an intern. While at USC Aiken, she served as Editor in Chief (1999), Managing Editor (1998), and Business/Advertising Manager (1997) for the Pacer Times, the USC Aiken weekly student newspaper. Hanna worked for the North Augusta Star as a staff writer from 1997-1998. She began her career at the Aiken Standard in 1999, where she served as a reporter, copy editor and copy desk chief. Hanna then left Aiken in 2004 to work at the Athens Banner-Herald in Athens, Ga., serving a seven-year span as the assistant news editor, multimedia director and, ultimately, executive editor before returning home in 2011 to serve as the multimedia director at the Aiken Standard. She was promoted to executive editor of the Aiken Standard and North Augusta Star in January 2013.
