Jesse Mullen, Director of Pagination and Copy Editing at the Miamisburg, Ohio Civitas Media pagination hub, has been with Civitas since April 2013. Prior to joining the company, he worked in a variety of roles from copy editor to publisher at weekly and daily newspapers across the Rocky Mountain West and Northwest.

Starting as a paperboy for the Sioux City Journal, Jesse moved on to writing and selling for the family-owned Newcastle (Wyoming) News Letter Journal in the eighth grade. I'd like to nominate Jesse Mullen, director of pagination and copy editing at Civitas Media, for the National Newspaper Association's 2014 Daniel M. Phillips Leadership Award.

Jesse is a colleague of mine within Civitas. I joined the company in September, a few months after the newspaper I edit — The Times Leader in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania — shifted production to Jesse's hub in Miamisburg, Ohio.

As with all transitions, that shift wasn't without its problems. Jesse was my counterpart in Miamisburg, helping to put out the frequent fires we had early into the transition.

Despite the fact that The Times Leader wasn't his only concern, Jesse always made us feel like a priority. No matter how busy he was, nor how many new papers his hub was folding into the mix, Jesse made time for me and my team. Problems were resolved quickly and thoughtfully.

In my view, that's the mark of a real leader: the ability to perform gracefully under pressure.

In very short order and through very hard work, Jesse reinforced the company's philosophical message on how it wants newsrooms to operate. We had gone from a newsroom that did everything — writing, copy editing, designing — to a newsroom that was able to focus exclusively on producing great content. He did that by ensuring a smooth transition of dozens of publications to a hub model in Miamisburg.

Jesse's ability to work across myriad publications, led by editors with very different personalities, in a company that was very new and in the early stages of identifying itself, is a testament to the kind of leader he is.

Jesse is decisive, responsive and a pleasure to work with. He's an ideal match for the Daniel M. Phillips Leadership Award.
