Only when readers are hooked does Limerick build his case by recounting the projects that have been passed or completed without public input —including a middle school built by the county but without city involvement—during the previous four years, noting the promised but not delivered technology that would enhance virtual meetings, and pointing out that surrounding communities have reinstated in-person meetings. Then he switches gears, acknowledging that virtual meetings have their virtues and proposing a couple of compromises before describing in poignant detail moments of physical connection during the last in-person meeting, held in 2020. Limerick threads dates and figures and email responses from officials through his narrative, and he offers solid reasons for a return to in-person meetings. But Limerick's way with words and his finesse in presenting his case make this an editorial worth studying.
